## ► RECRUITING NEW MEMBERS

Spend some time promoting the 4-H animal and dairy science projects. This would be an excellent time to make personal contacts with potential project members, doing a news release or a radio program, having a county meeting, organizing livestock clubs, or whatever works for you.

#### **► MAINE-ANJOU CATTLE**

The Mississippi breeders of Maine-Anjou cattle with the cooperation of the American Maine-Anjou Association have recommended that the minimum percentage of blood be accepted for Maine-Anjou cattle at the State Fair, District Shows, and Dixie National Junior Round-Up be changed to 50% for bulls and heifers. However, the animal showing

must be sired by a Maine-Anjou bull with an AMAA number on the registration paper. If there is no number beside the sire's name, this animal would not be eligible to show as a Maine-Anjou. This percentage change will go into effect at the 2001 Mississippi State Fair.

#### **►GELBVIEH CATTLE**

At the request of the Mississippi Gelbvieh Association, the percentage of blood accepted for Gelbvieh cattle at the Mississippi State Fair, District Shows and Dixie National Junior Round-Up will change to 94% for bulls and 75% for heifers. This percentage will go into effect at the 2001 Mississippi State Fair.

#### **▶**CONTESTS REMINDERS

4-H district and 4-H Club Congress Contests will be here soon. Now is the time to be lining up participation and planning county contests. Contests in the 4-H animal and dairy sciences area are Visual Presentations for juniors (three divisions included [1] beef, sheep, swine; [2] horse; [3] dairy animals, dairy products) AND seniors (four divisions included [1] beef; [2] sheep,swine; [3] dairy animals; [4] dairy products.) Other contests available are meats judging/identification contest, meats bowl, and dairy bowl for senior members and dairy products judging for juniors and seniors. These are excellent contests. If we can provide you with information about these contests, please let me know.

**Reminder:** The Senior 4-H Horse Visual Presentation Contest will be at the State 4-H Horse Show this year.

This is a change from what we previously have done.

#### ► MISSISSIPPI JUNIOR DAIRY PRODUCTION CONTEST

I encourage you to give special promotion to our junior production contests. The 4-H dairy project member must own a registered Holstein or Jersey cow that is on an approved testing program. An entry form, JD-1, must be filled out within 60 days after the cow is fresh. The participants' entries will be ranked on ECM and awards are given at the annual meeting of the Holstein and Jersey Associations.

#### ►MSU LIVESTOCK JUDGING WORKSHOP & ORAL REASONS CAMP

The Animal and Dairy Sciences Department will again be conducting Livestock Judging & Oral Reasons Camps for those students involved with judging team activities. This will be a very intensive  $3\frac{1}{2}$  day school with session held all day and each evening. The schools will be conducted by Tommy Shields, MSU Livestock Judging Team Coach, with assistance from current judging team members.

The first school will start on Tuesday, June 5, at 10:00 a.m. and conclude with a contest on Friday morning, June 8, finishing at noon. The second school will start on Tuesday, June 12, at 10:00 a.m. and conclude with a contest on Friday morning, June 15, finishing at noon. The cost for the school will be \$125.00 for participating youth which includes room, meals, tee-shirt, and pizza party. The students will stay in a dorm with meals in the cafeteria. The students will need to bring bedding and towels. We would also like to invite any interested Ag teachers or County Agents to attend for a charge of \$85.00.

This will be a working school, but also provides interaction with MSU staff members and students and other 4-H and FFA members . . . a great opportunity for those wanting to become competitive in judging contests and improve upon their communication skills. Alert your judging team members about this workshop. The school will be limited to the first 25 applications - - at least 14 years of age and still in school. Registration forms are due May 10, 2001. We will send more details to you once the registration form is received. If you did not receive a registration form sent out in April, please call 662/325-2802.

#### ►MSU CATTLEMEN'S COLLEGE

The MSU Cattlemen's College will be held April 28, 2001, at the MS Horse Park & AgriCenter in Starkville. Registration will begin at 8:00 a.m. The youth program will include beef skillathon contest, a beef quiz bowl, the how to's of beef judging and Junior Limousin Show. There is no registration fee and no charge for the noon lunch.

#### ►ALERT HORSE PROJECT MEMBERS ABOUT OWNERSHIP!!!

Remind your 4-H'ers and adult leaders that <u>May 1</u> is ownership deadline for horses to be shown in the 2000 4-H horse shows. Also, each horse showing in the district 4-H horse shows must be accompanied by original registration

certificate or official ownership form for grade horses. Copies of registration certificate or ownership form must also be sent in with entries by district show deadline. Horses must be in the name of the 4-H'er, or in the name of an immediate family member (farm name is not eligible).

Also, an official certificate showing a current (good for one year) negative Coggins test will be required on all horses that show in district and state 4-H horse shows. These certificates will be checked and must be in possession of the exhibitor and/or with the horse at the shows. Now is the time to be taking care of these important matters. Alert your 4-H'ers.

#### →ANIMAL PREMIUMS FOR DISTRICT SHOWS

A blue ribbon beef or dairy animal at the district shows paid \$34.71, while a red ribbon received \$23.27. A blue ribbon lamb, hog, or goat received \$17.35, while a red ribbon received \$11.59.

#### **▶DIXIE NATIONAL SALE OF JUNIOR CHAMPIONS**

The 2001 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Sale was another fantastic activity for our youth involved in the Animal & Dairy Sciences Program. This was the eighth year in a row for the sale to gross over \$100,000. Gross total for the 32 animals sold was \$116,264.00. The eight steers averaged \$5.31/lb; the eleven hogs averaged \$10.09/lb; and the thirteen lambs averaged \$18.00/lb. The Grand Champion Steer which was purchased by Ergon, Inc. and Blue Cross Blue Shield of Mississippi sold for \$9.00/lb. for a total of \$11,493.00 and was the highest selling animal in the sale. The Grand Champion Lamb which was purchased by Southern Farm Bureau Federation and Southern Farm Bureau Life, sold for \$24.00/lb. for a total of \$3,168.00. The Grand Champion Hog which was purchased by Wilson Slaughter House and Wilson Farms sold for \$23.00/lb. for a total of \$5,934.00.

The Sale of Junior Champions has meant a lot to our Mississippi youth livestock program over the years. The 32 sales have grossed \$2,261,065.15 which is quite impressive. The first sale in 1970 had a gross total of \$7,621.35. This outstanding activity has come a long way!

We salute all buyers, contributors, sale committee members, Extension staff members assisting with the sale, and other supporters who help make this a special event for our youth.
