► **REMINDER – 2002 DISTRICT AND JUNIOR ROUND-UP SHOWS!!**

◆ **PURCHASING PROJECT ANIMALS FOR SPRING SHOWS**

Spring shows will be here soon. Now is a good time to run a final survey of your 4-H'ers to determine if additional purchases are needed, and be locating them. The only ownership deadlines that have passed are for steers, market goats, and lambs. So all other project animals can still be purchased. Ownership deadlines on project animals for spring shows are:

Market Goats	- September 1	Beef Breeding	- December 1
Market Lambs	- September 1	Commercial Beef Heifers	- December 1
Steers	- September 1	Hogs	- December 1
Purebred Dairy	- December 1	Dairy Goats	- December 1
Commercial Dairy Heifers	- December 1		

◆ **CATTLE REGISTRATION PAPERS FOR JUNIOR SHOWS**

Double check registration papers on breeding beef and purebred dairy to be sure they are in proper order. Now is the time to correct any problems. Remember that papers must be in the 4-H'ers name only. Farm names or joint ownership with adults are not acceptable. Don't assume that everything is right – check!! Papers may be in multiple siblings' names provided they are all 18 years of age or younger.

◆ **ENTRIES FOR DISTRICT & ROUND-UP SHOWS**

Now is the time to be getting your entries in order. You will be getting more information soon about these events. All purebred dairy, commercial dairy heifers, beef breeding, commercial beef heifers and dairy goats (district only) will be entered on the X drive like we did for State Fair. **These entries will be due Friday, January 4, 2002.**

◆ **STEERS, COMMERCIAL BEEF HEIFERS, AND COMMERCIAL DAIRY HEIFERS**

Double check with your 4-H'ers who are exhibiting steers, commercial beef heifers, and commercial dairy heifers about horns. All commercial beef heifers and steers showing at the District and Round-Up Shows must be polled or dehorned, with no scurs or regrowth to exceed 1½ inches above the skin. All commercial dairy heifers must be dehorned. Too often with a poor job of dehorning, regrowth may occur. Now is the time to take off the horns or any regrowth to allow for proper healing.

Registered heifers are not eligible for the commercial heifer shows.

◆ **HOGS SHOWING AT 2002 DISTRICT AND ROUND-UP SHOWS**

All market hogs for the 2002 District and Round-Up Shows must be nominated and ear tagged within 15 days after ownership deadline. Below are the dates for deadlines:

December 1, 2001	- Ownership deadline on hogs for 2002 District & Round-Up Shows
December 15, 2001	- Nomination forms on hogs for 2002 District & Round-Up Shows and submitted county nominations on the X drive.

Nomination Process for Hogs- What you must submit for each hog nominated:

1. Individual nomination form for each hog. Each nomination form must be complete and signed by the exhibitor, parent, and supervising Extension Agent or Vo-Ag Advisor.
2. Official ear tag number – each hog must be tagged with official ear tag for 2002 prior to nomination deadline.
3. Submit county entries on X drive (information on procedure to do this will come later)
4. Hard copy of information on X drive (keep a hard copy for your files).

Please let hog exhibitors know about these dates and double check with them to be sure your records are in order and that all market hogs are properly entered. Do not send us nomination forms after deadline date. Please do not wait until the last day to take care of this business.

Order form for hog tags and nomination forms for hogs were sent to you earlier. If you failed to get this material, please call my office. County Extension Agents or Vo-Ag Advisors must make nominations of hogs under their supervision.

All hogs must be ear tagged (by December 15th) and nomination forms must be (duplicate forms as needed) returned to the MSU Animal and Dairy Sciences Department by December 15, 2001.

Each hog must have an individual nomination form and form must be complete, including breed information, signed by the exhibitor, parent, and Extension Agent/Vo-Ag Advisor.

◆ **EXHIBITOR'S AGE FOR DISTRICT LIVESTOCK SHOWS & DIXIE NATIONAL JUNIOR ROUND-UP**

Remember that exhibitor's age will be 8 –18 years of age as of December 31, 2001. You have the responsibility to see that all exhibitors are of the proper age.

◆ **VOLUNTEER LEADERS MUST BE CERTIFIED**

VOLUNTEER LEADERS WHO MAY BE ASSISTING YOUR 4-H'ERS GROOM ANIMALS MUST BE OFFICIALLY CERTIFIED VOLUNTEER LEADERS OF THE 4-H PROGRAM IN MISSISSIPPI. This means you must submit the names of these volunteers to the State 4-H Department, if you did not do this for the State Fair in October. The volunteer leaders submitted in the fall will still be on the list. However, if you have additions, the names must be submitted as soon as possible. Be sure to list the volunteer leaders who will be assisting your 4-H'ers with animals at the show. Prior to the Dixie National I will secure a list of additions to the volunteer list from the State 4-H Department.

► **DIXIE NATIONAL LIVESTOCK SHOW & RODEO 4-H/FFA CALF SCRAMBLE**

The calf scramble for 4-H'ers at the Dixie National Livestock Show & Rodeo will be on Sunday, February 10, 2002. Please find attached the rules and entry form for this event.

► **LIVESTOCK ETHICS CERTIFICATION PROGRAM**

As you know any 4-H or FFA exhibitor and at least one parent that plans to exhibit animals at the 2002 District Livestock Shows and Mississippi Junior Round-Up must have completed the **Livestock Ethics Certification Program**. All Extension Agents and Vo-Ag Advisors that plan to teach the Livestock Ethics Certification Program must also be certified.

► **2001 MISSISSIPPI STATE FAIR RESULTS**

The 2001 Mississippi State Fair junior livestock shows were excellent youth events. Participation was up in the steer and hog shows, along with the Dairy Sweetheart Contest. This was the first year for the Commercial Dairy Heifer Show, 4-H Livestock Judging, 4-H Dairy Judging, Beef Cookout Contest, and Pork Cookout Contest at the State Fair.

The State Fair was really an outstanding event and "showcase" for the junior livestock program in Mississippi. The number of people involved in these events and the crowds in attendance at the shows were very impressive. 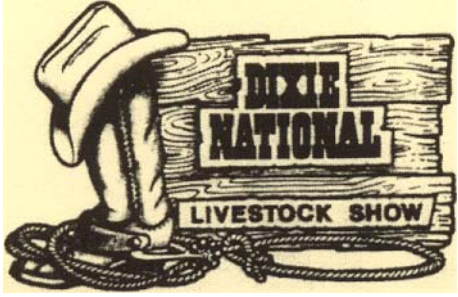

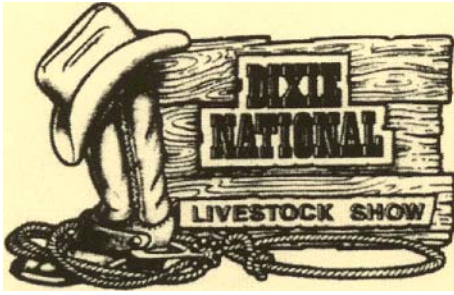

DIXIE NATIONAL LIVESTOCK SHOW & RODEO CALF SCRAMBLE RULES

1. A team will consist of two (2) members. The scramble is open to both male and female participants.
2. The scramble will be limited to no more than 20 teams which will compete during the rodeo performance.
3. Each participant must have completed the official entry form, had signed and notarized, and returned it to the Dixie National in order to compete.
4. The Dixie National or Harper & Morgan Rodeo Co. will not be responsible for any accident which may occur to any participant in the calf scramble before, during or after the event.
5. All participants will be required to attend a rules meeting prior to the scramble on the day of their respective scramble. The meeting will be held at 6:30 PM in the Dixie Sales Arena. **FAILURE TO ATTEND THE RULES MEETING IS GROUNDS FOR DISQUALIFICATION.**
6. Participants will be taken into the arena and placed by the arena director at the designated time.
7. Each team will furnish their own halter to be used in the scramble. The halter cannot be used as a lariat. The halter must be placed around the head of the animal in the designated and correct way. It cannot be just placed around the neck of the animal.
8. At no time will a participant be permitted to tie the rope to his/her body or belt.
9. Each team of participants will attempt to catch and halter one of the calves released. The team, after haltering the calf, must lead, pull, and push the calf to the finish line without help from other participants.
10. If one or both members of a team have hold of a calf, no other participant will be allowed to touch the calf unless it breaks away and frees itself.
11. If a participant catches a calf by the tail, he/she will have a reasonable amount of time to work up to the calves head; otherwise, the referee will order the participant to let the calf go.
12. If members of two different teams catch the same calf, the calf will be turned loose.
13. A team of participants who catches, properly halters and leads the calf to the finish line will be declared a winner when so indicated by the referee.
14. Undue roughness to the animals or other participants will not be tolerated and it will result in disqualification by the referee.
