# **▶**CONTESTS REMINDERS

4-H district and 4-H Club Congress Contests will be here soon. Now is the time to be lining up participation and planning county contests. Contests in the 4-H animal and dairy sciences area are Visual Presentations for juniors (three divisions included [1] beef, sheep, swine, market goats; [2] horse; [3] dairy animals, dairy goats, dairy products) AND seniors (four divisions included [1] beef; [2] sheep, swine, market goats; [3] dairy animals; [4] dairy products.) Other contests available are meats judging/identification contest, meats bowl, and dairy bowl for senior members and dairy products judging for juniors and seniors. These are excellent contests. If we can provide you with information about these contests, please let me know.

# ▶ 4-H DAIRY PRODUCTS JUDGING WORKSHOP

A 4-H dairy products judging workshop for 4-H'ers, volunteers and agents will be held Thursday, May 27th at 10:00 a.m. in Herzer Hall on the MSU campus. Ms. Julie Wilson with the Food Science and Technology Department will provide the training. Please let me know by May 24th, if you have participants that plan to attend the training. This would be an excellent opportunity for your 4-H'ers that plan to participate in this contest at district or state competition.

# ▶ 4-H MEATS JUDGING AND IDENTIFICATION WORKSHOP

A 4-H Meats Judging and Identification Workshop for 4-H'ers, volunteers and agents will be held Friday, May 28th at 10:00 a.m. in 119 Ballew Hall on the MSU campus. The workshop should conclude around 3:00 p.m. Please let me know by May 24th, if you have participants that plan to attend the training.

The state winning team in this contest will represent Mississippi at the National Contest in Denver, CO.

#### ► MSU LIVESTOCK EVALUATION CAMP AND ORAL REASONS CAMP

Mississippi State University will be conducting a Livestock Evaluation Camp and an Oral Reasons Camp for those students involved with judging team activities. These will be very intensive  $2\frac{1}{2}$  day trainings with sessions held all day and one or two evenings. Tommy Shields will conduct these camps assisted by former and current judging team members. Each camp will be limited to the first 20 applicants, at least 12 years old and still in school. The livestock evaluation camp will start on Monday, June 21st, at 10:00 a.m. and conclude with a contest

on Wednesday morning, June 23rd, finishing at noon. The Oral Reasons camp will begin on Wednesday, June 23rd, at 1:30 p.m. and conclude with a contest on Friday morning, June 25th, finishing at noon. The cost for the camps will be \$150.00 each and includes room, meals, bowling, and pizza party. The students will stay in a dorm with catered meals. The students will need to bring bedding and towels. We would also like to invite any interested County Agents to attend. The registration fee for county agents or vo-ag teachers is \$100 each and includes instructional materials and methods for both the evaluation and oral reasons camps. # ▶4-H HORSE JUDGING WORKSHOP

The State 4-H Horse Judging Workshop for 4-H'ers, volunteers and agents will be held Tuesday, June 22nd starting at 9:00 a.m. on the Mississippi State Fairgrounds. Halter, performance and oral reasons will be covered at this workshop. This will be an excellent opportunity for your 4-H'ers that plan to participate in this year's contests to work out.

# ▶ PORK, BEEF & POULTRY COOKOUT CONTESTS - CHANGE!

The Pork and Beef Cookout Contests will not be held at the MS State Fair in 2004. We will have a north half contest for pork, beef and poultry and a south half contest for pork, beef and poultry. The contest for the north half of the state will be June 29th starting at 10:00 a.m. at the Yalobusha County Multi-Purpose Arena. This arena is located at the intersection of Hwy 7 and Hwy 330 west of Coffeeville. The contest for the south half of the state will be June 30th also starting at 10:00 a.m. at the Copiah County Multi-Purpose Arena. This arena is located in Gallman at Exit #65 off of Interstate 55. Additional information will be sent at a later date.

# ► ALERT HORSE PROJECT MEMBERS ABOUT OWNERSHIP & ETHICS CERTIFICATION!!!

Remind your 4-H'ers and adult leaders that May 1 is ownership deadline for horses to be shown in the 2004 4-H horse shows. Also, each horse showing in the district 4-H horse shows must be accompanied by original registration certificate or official ownership form for grade horses. Copies of registration certificate or ownership form must also be sent in with entries by district show deadline. Horses must be in the name of the 4-H'er, or in the name of an immediate family member (farm name is not eligible). Also, any youth that wishes to show in this year's District and State 4-H Horse Shows must be a 4-H member by May 1.

In addition, remind your 4-H'ers, parents and volunteers that all <u>4-H'ers who plan to show in the 2004 District</u> <u>& State 4-H Horse Shows and at least one parent must have completed the Ethics Certification program by June 1st.</u>

4-H'ers that are **only** competing in the non-riding contests (horse bowl, horse judging, art contest, photography contest, hippology, public speaking, and demonstration contests) do not have to be ethics certified. However, these 4-H'ers should be encouraged to be ethics certified!

An **official certificate** showing a current (good for one year) negative Coggins test will be required on all horses that show in district and state 4-H horse shows. These certificates will be checked and must be in possession of the exhibitor and/or with the horse at the shows. Exhibitors must also present **ORIGINAL** (no copy of original) registration papers at the district and state shows. If agent maintains original registration papers, agent **MUST BE PRESENT** at time of check in. Now is the time to be taking care of these important matters. Alert your 4-H'ers.

# ► HORSE BOWL QUESTIONS

If you plan to have a junior or senior team participate in the 4-H horse bowl contests at district or state, you may submit 25 questions per county for the junior teams and 25 questions per county for the senior teams. These questions are due in my office by May 1, 2004.

# ▶4-H DAIRY POSTER CONTEST

The theme for the 2004 Dairy Poster Contest is "*Power of Three*" (milk, cheese and yogurt) Publication 799 contains all the information about this contest and it can be obtained from Extension Supply by electronic publication ordering from Department A9. Your county winners in the three age divisions are to be delivered to the Bost Extension Center "B" on Tuesday, June 1, the first day of State 4-H Club Congress for judging in the state contest. The deadline will be 11:30 a.m. Good Luck!

# **▶**DIXIE NATIONAL SALE OF JUNIOR CHAMPIONS

The 2004 35th Sale of Junior Champions was another great event for our youth involved in the Animal and Dairy Sciences Program. The Sale's committee is to be commended for the hard work that they put into this sale to make it a record-breaking activity. This was the tenth year in a row for the sale to gross over \$100,000. Gross total for the 34 animals sold was \$192,284. The eight steers averaged \$7.63/lb.; the eleven hogs averaged \$20.92/lb.; the thirteen lambs averaged \$25.77/lb.; and the two goats averaged \$31.50/lb. The Grand Champion Steer, which was purchased by Ergon and Blue Cross Blue Shield of Mississippi sold for \$13.00/lb. for a total of

\$16,939 and was the highest selling animal in the sale. The Grand Champion Hog, which was purchased by Wilson Meat House and Wilson Farms, sold for \$55.00/lb. for a total of \$13,970. Selby and Richard McRae Foundaton purchased the Grand Champion Lamb for \$46.00/lb. for a total of \$6,670. The Grand Champion Goat, which was purchased by J. L. Holloway for \$33.00/lb. for a total of \$2,937.

The Sale of Junior Champions continues to mean a lot to our Mississippi youth livestock program. The 35 sales have grossed \$2,801,961.65, which is very impressive. The first sale in 1970 had a gross total of \$7,621.35. This outstanding activity has come a long way in 35 years!

The buyers, contributors, sale committee members, Extension staff members assisting with the sale, and other supporters who help make this a special event for our youth are to be commended. Thanks to everyone!
