History of the Mississippi State Fair

The Mississippi State Fair was founded in 1858. At that time, the Capitol Green was the public entrance to the fairgrounds. Some of the contests were best cornbread, best livestock in show, best handmade dress and best works of art. In 1903 after the new capitol was built, the State Fair was held in the old State Capitol building until 1912. The fair then moved to smaller buildings behind the Old Capitol and extended across Jefferson Street. The only times the fair was not held was in 1917-18 and 1942-44, when the United States was engaged in World War I and World War II, respectively. In addition, crowd events were reduced in 1917-1918 because of the Spanish flu pandemic, which was estimated to have killed millions of people around the world. The fairgrounds is now over 100 acres in downtown Jackson and is one of the widest fairgrounds. The Mississippi Coliseum is part of the fairgrounds. If you get a chance, head up to Jackson during the first two weeks in October and take a look at all of the things happening at the Mississippi State Fair!

The United States Congress established The Congressional Award in 1979 to recognize initiative, service and achievement in young people. The program is open to all youth in the United States between the ages of 14 (you can register at 13-1/2 years old) and 24. You can earn Bronze, Silver and Gold Certificates and Bronze, Silver and Gold Medals. For each level you will set goals in four program areas: Voluntary Public Service, Personal Development, Physical Fitness and Expedition/Exploration. You are already doing these things in 4-H! A 4-H Youth Trapping School will be held near Marks, MS on **Saturday, October 19, 2024,** beginning at 8:00 a.m. for youth ages 8-18. Registration is capped at 50 youth. Topics to be covered are types of traps for various predator and nuisance animal control, land & water management techniques, scents & lures for various applications and predator & nuisance animal management techniques. Livestock Information

State Fair, Jackson, MS
South MS Fair Junior Livestock Show & Poultry Chain Show
(entries due October 1, 2024 at midnight)

October 3-14, 2024 October 18-26, 2024

Call the Pearl River County Extension Service Office at 601-403-2280 for more information about these shows.

All market steers, commercial beef heifers, market lambs, market hair sheep, commercial meat goat does, wether dams, breeding hair sheep, market hogs, and market goats MUST BE validated (DNA hair sample collected) to show at the 2024 Mississippi State Fair and 2025 District and Dixie National Junior Round-Up Livestock Shows. During the validation period, steers, commercial beef heifers, market hair sheep, and breeding hair sheep will be classified as well. Validation and classification will be held on Monday, September 9, 2024, at the Forrest County Multi-purpose Center in Hattiesburg from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

All poultry testing will be conducted at the livestock validation site at the same times (see above paragraph). **REMINDER**: Testing is the entry to the State Fair. **NO EXCEPTIONS**.

For the 2025 District/DNJR shows, all market hogs, commercial gilts, and MS Bred Barrows must be owned and entered by December 2 and MUST BE validated. All market hogs and commercial gilts will be classified at the 2025 DNJR. For newly entered commercial beef heifers, wether dams, breeding hair sheep, and commercial meat goat does that were not processed in September, but were entered by December 2, these animals MUST BE validated, and the commercial beef heifers and breeding hair sheep will also be classified at the same time to show at the 2025 District and Dixie National Junior Round-Up Livestock Shows. This validation and classification will be held on Monday, December 9, 2024, at the Forrest County Multi-purpose Center in Hattiesburg from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

REMINDER: An Official Health Certificate with each animal identified will be required on all livestock showing at the 2024 Mississippi State Fair.
