#### **4-H Poultry Chain**

You can increase your knowledge of poultry management practices and life skills in the 4-H Poultry Chain. You have the opportunity to raise birds to sexual maturity while keeping a record of their progress. At the end of the project you will choose your top 3 birds to compete at the Mississippi State Fair in the poultry show. If you are a Cloverbud (ages 5-7 as of January 1, 2025) you will be able to compete on a county level. 4-H'ers ages 8-18 will be able to compete on the county and state level. You can only show one breed (females only) and must order at least 6 chicks (It is recommended that you order 20). There are 2 categories for chicks: Meat Category and Layer Category (call the office for a list of breeds). You must order your chicks from a NPIP-certified hatchery or a commercial operation that is supplied by an NPIP hatchery. Do NOT order from a NPIP-backyard flock. Now is the time to order your chicks to be delivered the week of May 18-24, 2025. You will need to register between April 1 and June 15 by calling the county office. Call the Pearl River County Extension Office at 601-403-2280 for more information.

#### **Youth Stockmanship Contest**

If you are a 4-Her ages 14-18 (as of January 1, 2025), the Youth Stockmanship Contest is a new opportunity for you. This contest will challenge you to improve your cattle handing and processing skills based on Beef Quality Assurance guidelines. Your teams will consist of 3 members. Each of you will be required to be Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) certified, have chuteside experience and have practiced on live cattle prior to competing in a contest. The regional contest will be held on **Tuesday**, **April 15**, **2025**, **at the White Sands Experiment Station in Poplarville**. If you are interested in competing, contact the Pearl River County Extension Office at 601-403-2280 by **Wednesday**, **March 26**, **2025**. # Sullivan Supply Cattle Clinic

Sullivan Supply is offering a free 2-day cattle clinic (registration is free but is required) on **May 24 and 25, 2025 at the Forrest County Multipurpose Center in Hattiesburg**. You are not required to bring their own cattle (listen and learn participants are welcome). Topics covered will be daily hair care, fitting, clipping, showmanship and more. Two lunches and one dinner will be sponsored by Sullivan Supply. If you plan to bring cattle, be prepared to bring generators to run blowers. Shavings must be bought from the Forrest County Multi-Purpose Center (no outside shavings allowed). RV spots are available for \$25 a night. NOTE: This event is not sponsored by Forrest County 4-H nor is it a 4-H event.

# **Rural Medical & Science Scholars Program**

Are you a high school junior? Are you interested in exploring healthrelated careers and STEM fields and earning 3 college credits through the course Introduction to Health Professions? If so, the 2025 Rural Medical & Science Scholars Program might be for you. It will take place from June 8 to June 20, 2025. In this program you will participate in a robust lecture and engaging workshop exploring public health and its connections to careers in health or science, opportunities to network with peers and professionals to create lifelong connections and a challenging yet rewarding experience that prepares you for your future academic and career goals. You can apply now, and the deadline to apply is April 14, **2025**. You will need to get a recommendation letter from your teacher, who will then forward your application and recommendation to your guidance counselor. Your counselor will send ACT scores and an official transcript. All of this takes time, so don't wait until the last minute to work on your application. #### Mississippi 4-H Wildlife Art & Photography Contests



The Mississippi 4-H Wildlife Art and Photography Contest is one opportunity to show off your talent or skill! The Art categories are Pastels/Charcoal/Graphite/Colored Pencil (Abstract or Realistic), Oil/Acrylic/ Watercolor (Abstract or Realistic), Pen/Ink/Markers/Crayon (Abstract or Realistic), Cartoon, Sculpture/3-D and Mixed, Altered Media. Photography categories are Action, Non-Action and Human Interest (Digital only). Photographs must be 5"x7" format in sleeve. Age divisions are 8-13 years old and 14-18 years old (as of January 1, 2025). Entries are due in the Pearl River County Extension Service Office by **Friday**, **April 11, 2025**. The top 5 entries in each category will go on to be judged at the district level, top 5 there go on to Region level, top 5 there go on to State Level, and the top 5 in the state will go on to be displayed at the MS Wildlife Expo in Jackson in late July/early August. 


# **Visual Presentations**

District Project Achievement Day and Club Congress will be here before we know it! Now is the time to start preparing for contests. One of the contests in which you can compete is visual presentations. Here are some tips to help you to prepare your visual presentation:

- Start by choosing a subject that is easily understood, useful and interesting to your audience and about which you are enthusiastic and in which you believe
- Plan your visual presentation on paper by listing supplies you will need (equipment, flash drive or other things), collecting correct information approved by the Extension 4-H Agent, listing the steps to be shown in order, deciding what you will say along with each step and planning how you will use equipment and materials
- Divide your speaking parts into an introduction, the body and a summary
- Use a gimmick (personal experience, famous saying, riddle, poem or skit, song or film clip, dramatic or shocking statement or problem, ask a question or show a completed project) in your introduction to draw the attention of your audience
- Discuss the main points, explain each step and eliminate unnecessary information that does not contribute to the main points when writing the body of your speech
- Highlight the main points, state sources of information and ask for questions in your summary
- Plan your visuals and make them easy to see (in PowerPoint presentations use short bullets and make the letters large enough to read when projected, pay attention to the colors in your background and the words to make them easier to read, use grafts to illustrate points when needed, include colorful graphics for interest and to emphasize your points and keep your design simple
- Select a title that will suggest the subject without telling the whole story
- Plan your appearance (dress neatly and be well groomed, avoid jewelry and mannerisms that will distract your audience, stand tall and make eye contact with your audience)
- Be prepared (make sure slides are in order, loosen caps or tops and cover brand names if you are using items to demonstrate, if using trays line them with paper towels to lessen noise and arrange items in the order of use)
- Practice, practice to help you do things in logical order, stay within the time limit, use visuals skillfully and know if you have enough information about your subject
